We acknowledge receipt of your letter dated 9 September 2025, which was registered at the European Environment Agency (EEA) on 16 September 2025. We thank you for contacting the EEA and for sharing your concerns with us.

The EEA is the European Union agency tasked with providing reliable information on the state and outlook of the environment. Its objective is to ensure that decision-makers and the public are well-informed through the collection and analysis of environmental data from Member States, other EU institutions, and international organisations. Based on these data, the EEA produces reports covering a wide range of environmental topics. While the majority of our knowledge and assessments are available at the country level, some information is also accessible at local and regional levels, for example in relation to Natura 2000 sites.

Please note that the implementation of European environmental legislation falls outside the EEA's remit. The Agency does not set or enforce environmental policies and does not provide legal or technical assistance in relation to complaints regarding environmental legislation. Consequently, the EEA does not have the mandate or investigative powers to address the concerns raised in your message. In particular, we do not undertake independent assessments of national, regional or local projects, nor do we provide recommendations to the European Commission on such matters. Accordingly, we are unable to respond positively to your requests.
